From the Pastor's desk:

Do you really and truly believe in the *Real Presence* of Christ in the Eucharist? Sadly, there is a growing number of Catholics who do not, especially among the younger generation. This weekend's gospel reading offers us an opportunity to reaffirm our own faith in the "*Real Presence*". In this reading, we hear Jesus promise that "whoever eats this bread will live forever". In a culture that is obsessed with putting off death and extending the appearance of youth, one would think that such a promise would indeed be good news.

The first reading from the Book of Proverbs sets the tone for our faith in the *Real Presence*. God's divine wisdom is personified as a woman who is lavish in preparing food and drink and invites others to come and enjoy what she has prepared. In the New Testament, this image of a banquet becomes a metaphor for the gift of salvation that God offers to us in Jesus Christ.

The selection that we hear from Paul's letter continues this theme of wisdom, and he cautions us to choose wisely. The wisdom of the world is a dead-end street. The wisdom of the Holy Spirit, on the other hand, is our reason for giving thanks. We should be SO thankful for this wisdom which gives ultimate meaning to our lives.

Giving thanks is what the word Eucharist means in Greek. In John's Gospel, Jesus is the Word made flesh. We are grateful that Jesus becomes one of us and shares our human life. His words and deeds are real food for living a meaningful life. Jesus guarantees his abiding presence when he promises: *"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."*

A beautiful sign for all this is lay people serving Communion at Mass. It is a sign of the calling that both clergy and lay people have to bring Jesus to the world. As God gives us life in Jesus Christ, so we are to give life by making our faith active in the world. When we fail to do this, we lessen the credibility of what we say we believe. Perhaps faith in the Real Presence is weakening because some of us fail to live out our own participation in that mystery. "*Be careful how you live*", says Saint Paul – a word to the wise that is still timely.

Those who wish to live forever (i.e. all of us) would do well to acknowledge the truth of Jesus' words, and to eat his flesh and drink his blood, and to do so worthily. Then, we will have life because of him. Sadly, when children stop believing in Santa, the Easter Bunny and the Tooth Fairy, it is too easy for them to believe Jesus and the Eucharist to also a fairy tale. The Jews asked, "how can this man give us his flesh to eat?" The answer is simple yet profound – because he is God, because God is good, and because God is love.
