## From the Pastor's desk:

The famous Helen Keller was born deaf and blind. When at last she learned to communicate in her teenage years, her teacher decided it was time for her to learn about Jesus. So she called the local minister. And with the teacher interpreting, the minister talked to Helen Keller about Jesus. At first, he wasn't sure she'd understand. But before long, a wonderful smile lighted Helen's face, and through her interpreter Helen spoke to the minister, "Reverend, I've always known about God, but until now, I didn't know his name."

Helen Keller was born blind and deaf, but she always knew how to see and to hear what really matters. If only "we" could do the same. So much of the time, the best parts of life rush past us all unnoticed, especially in our current culture of busyness. In so many ways, our eyes/ears/hearts are like drains that are all stopped up: Nothing can get through; none of the best of life can get through. And that's surely not what God wants for us.

God wants to say to us what he said to the deaf man in this weekend's Gospel, "Be opened!" But before God can speak that powerful word to us, we have to ask for it and desire it deeply. It would be wise for us to ask (with all our hearts), "I want to hear, Lord, and I want to see. I'm ready for whatever you want to show me, and for whatever you want me to do."

But the problem is, that speaking those words to God is impossible, if we don't know we're missing something, if we don't know we're not hearing, or not seeing something important. And that's the purpose of this weekend's Gospel: To raise in our hearts the crucial question: What are we missing? In what parts of our life are we deaf and blind to?

That's what God is urging us to do today: Ask that question as best we can, and then ask his help in listening to the answer. God always answers those kinds of prayers and will always say "yes".

So in the silence of our hearts, let us speak those words to him now:

"Open our eyes and ears, Lord, that we may see all things you do. And open our hearts, Lord, that we may give and do our very best, in each moment of life, just as You always do. Amen."

My door is always open, and you are always welcome.
