From Father Mike

The year 2020 has been one that has been driven by COVID-19, and for Americans is has been augmented as a year of raised awareness of racial inequities and strident politics. As a Catholic, I always appreciate how the liturgical calendar is not something separate from the rest of our life but how it constantly applies to whatever is happening in our personal and communal life. A perfect example is this weekend, the last Sunday of our church year, which ends with today's celebration of the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. What a well-timed reminder that Jesus—not some virus, social injustice, or political divide—is the one in charge of our world and who is the driving force of our lives. And while we have had to certainly adapt to the current pandemic, nevertheless, if we recognize Christ as King, then neither the coronavirus nor any other challenges need to ruin our lives. When Pope Pius Xi proclaimed this a feast in 1925, he stated that Catholics who acknowledge the reign of Christ "will gain much strength and courage, enabling them to form their lives after the true Christian ideal." If Jesus is the ideal for us, especially as he models being the one who shepherds and cares for others as today's readings describe, then we will be much more fulfilled by being his loyal followers than by ruling our own lives. Long live Christ, our Universal King! ¡Viva Cristo Rey!

To declare that Christ is the King of the Universe is to declare that one does not depend on any political party or any social ideology because we are of Christ. In the final judgement we will be judged by our commitment to the needy and by whether we were able to see Christ in those in need that were in our lives.
